# Cleghorn History



**In 1764, Col. John McDowell was granted 2,000 acres around Cleghorn Creek by the Royal Governor. This land is now part of Rutherford County, North Carolina, and is a few miles north of the South Carolina border. Sometime after 1820, the land was acquired by a Scot planter, Thomas McEntire, who was born in Ayrshire, Scotland, in 1782. In 1837, he built his two-story manor house on a hilltop overlooking his fields. It was made of brick with foot thick walls throughout and two chimneys. A large sweeping exterior staircase led to the second floor, which was considered the main floor. Oral history says that the house was designed by David Paton, who was the supervising architect for the State Capitol in Raleigh. The plantation grew cotton, tobacco, and corn. It survived the Civil War, when it was used as a Union headquarters near the end of the war.**



**In the late 19<sup>th</sup> century, it was purchased by the Washburn family, who lived there until the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century. Above is the earliest known photograph of the house.**

**In 1940, the house was remodeled, and the original staircase that led to the main hall on the second floor was removed, and the lower floor entrance became the main entrance. In 1970, the plantation was purchased by development company, and a championship golf course surround the house, along with many private homes and a country club.**

**In the 1990's, the house, which was being used as the clubhouse for the golf course, was remodeled again to become a first-class restaurant.**
